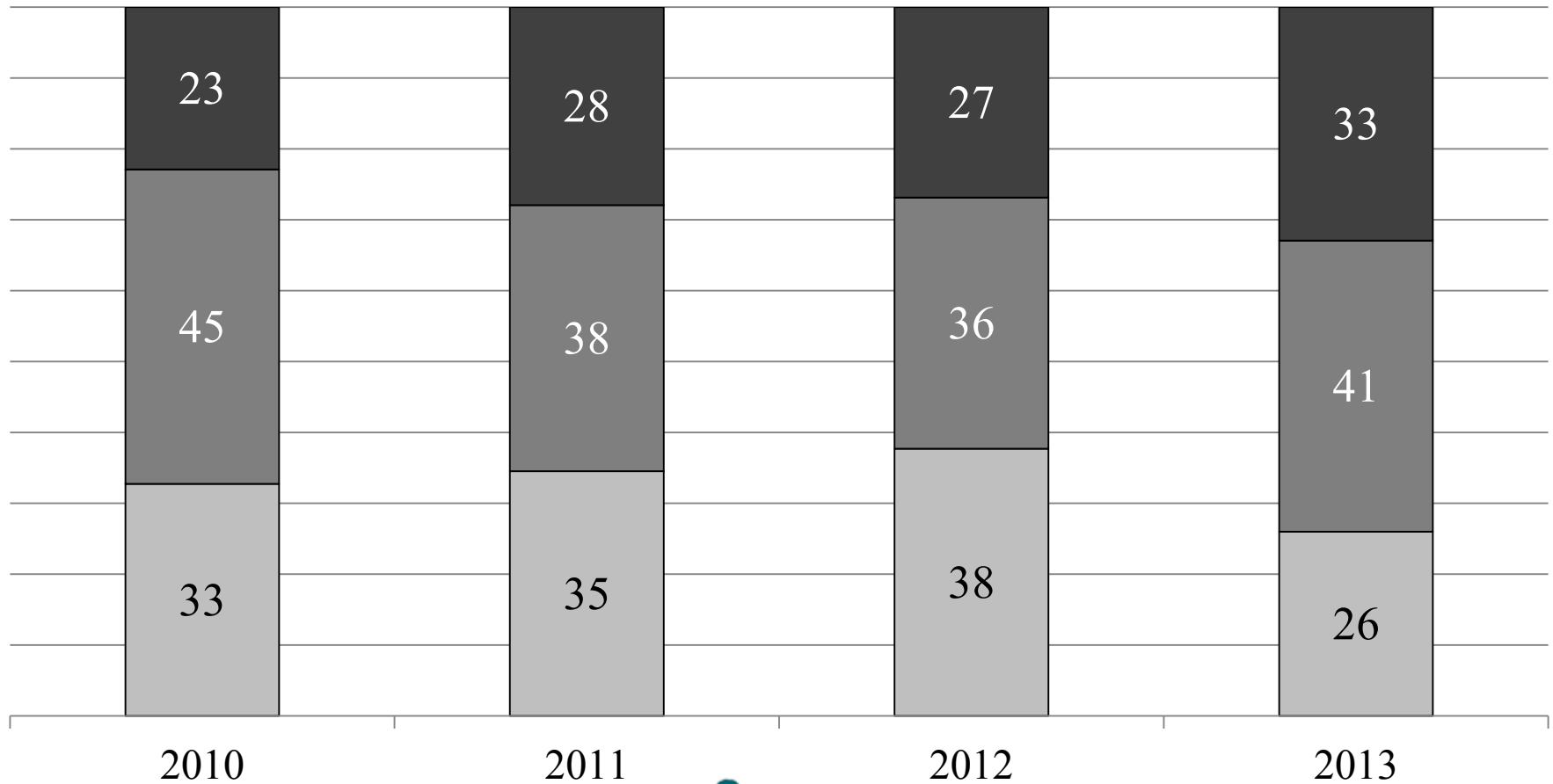

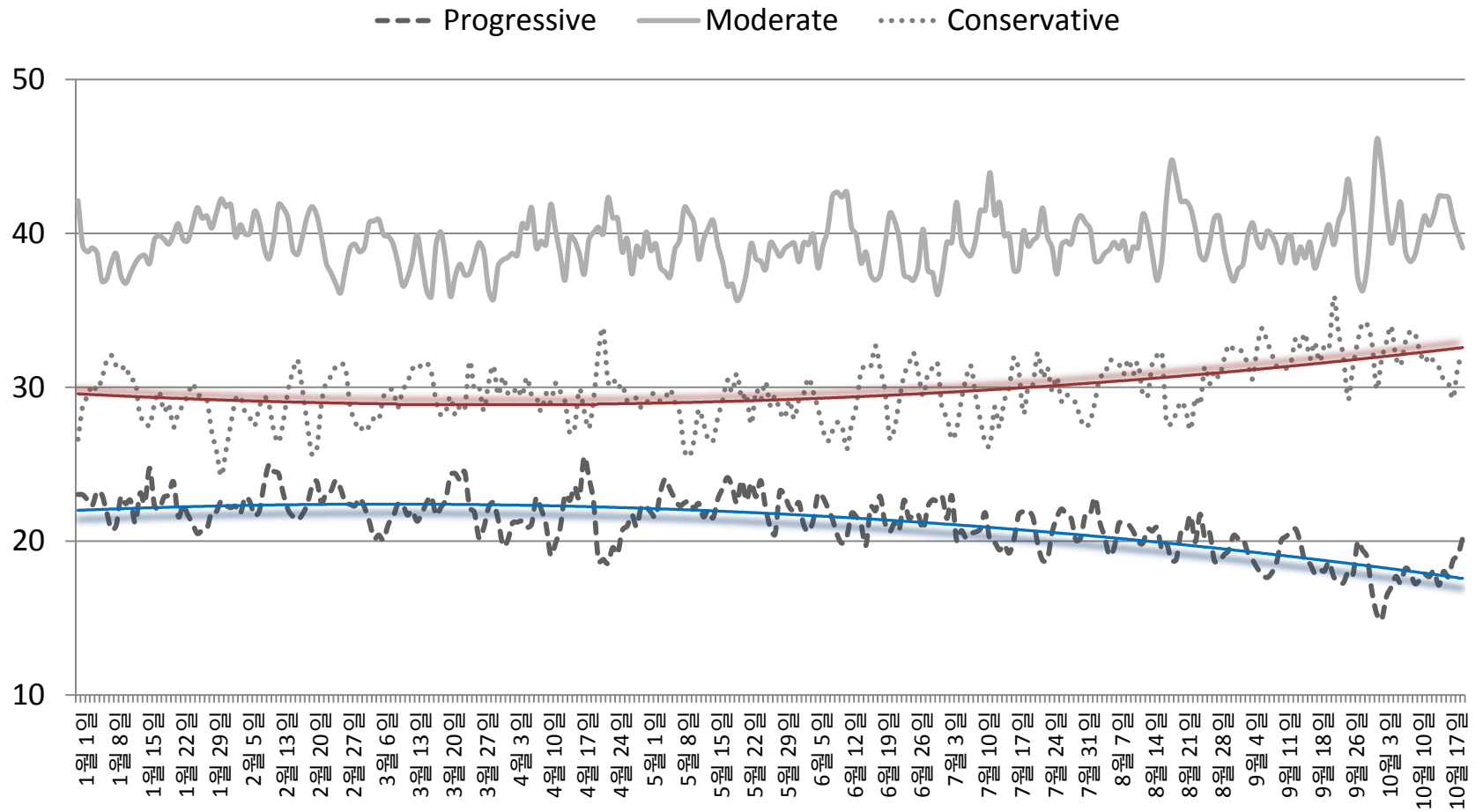

■ Progressive   ■ Moderate   ■ Conservative

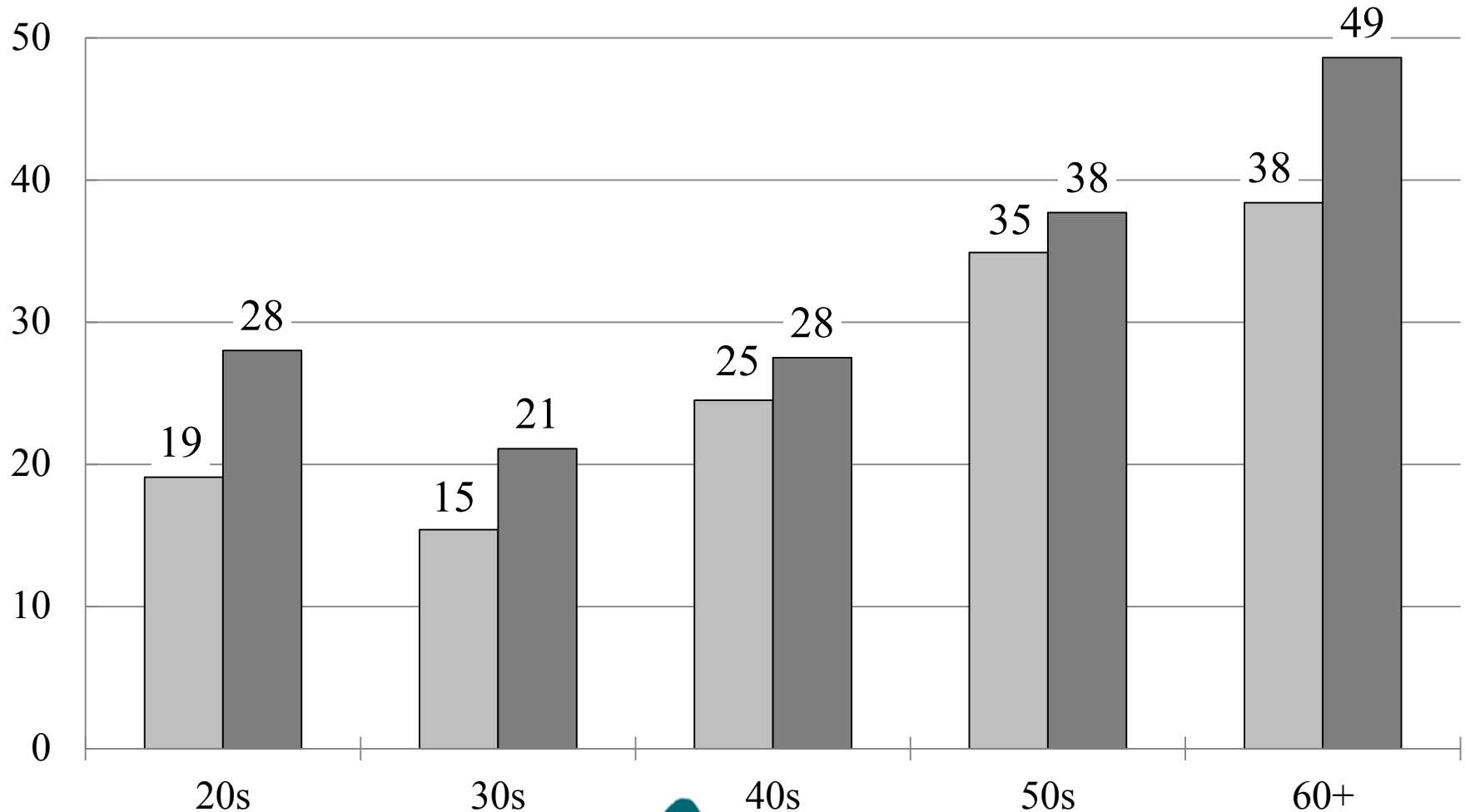


# Self-Identified Ideological Position



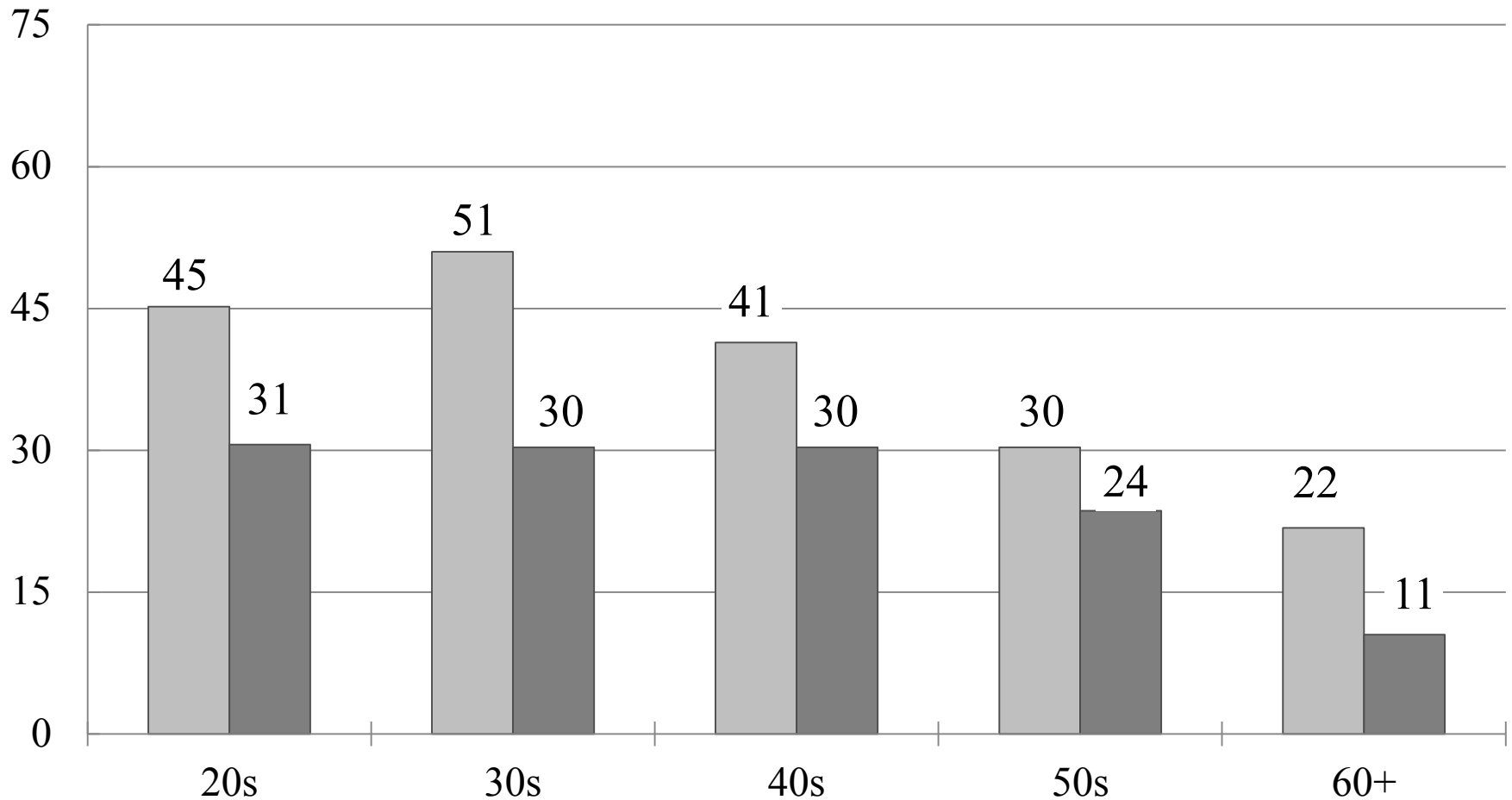
# Self-identified Conservative: By Age

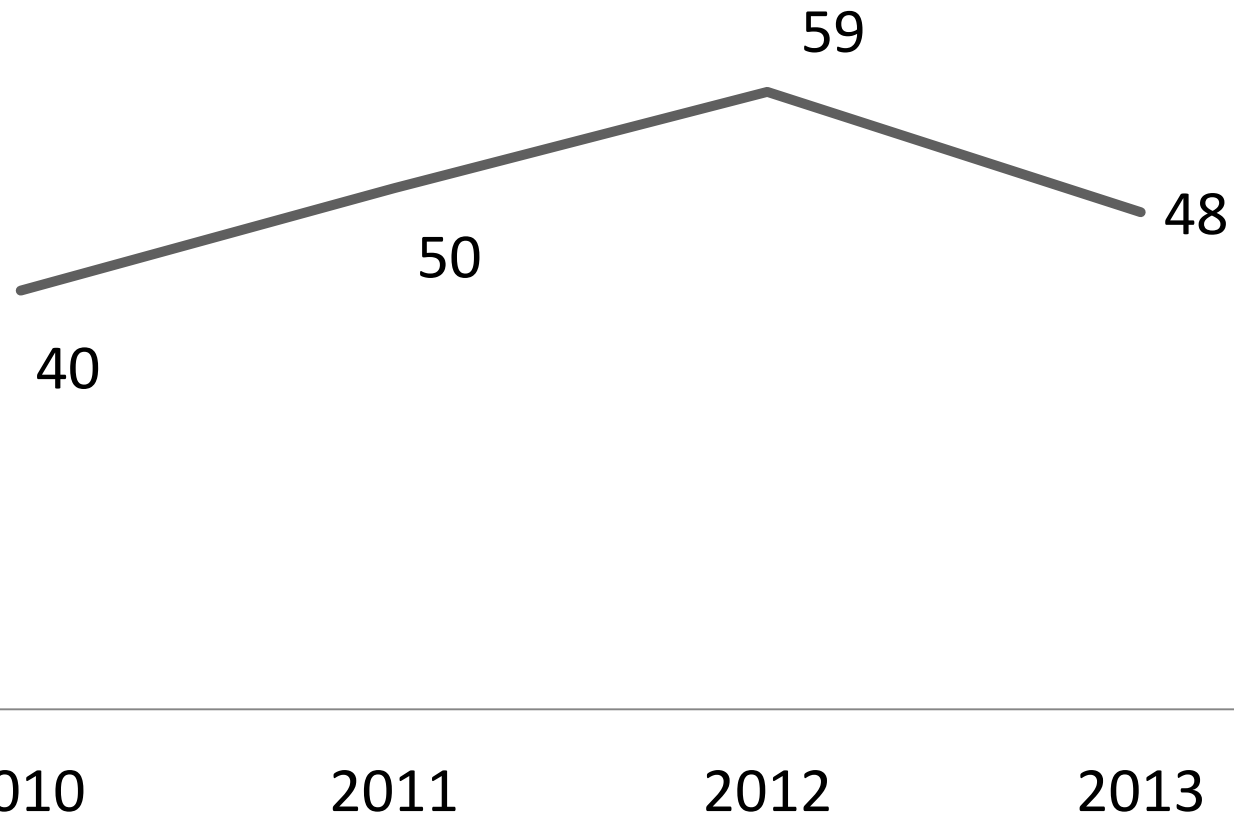

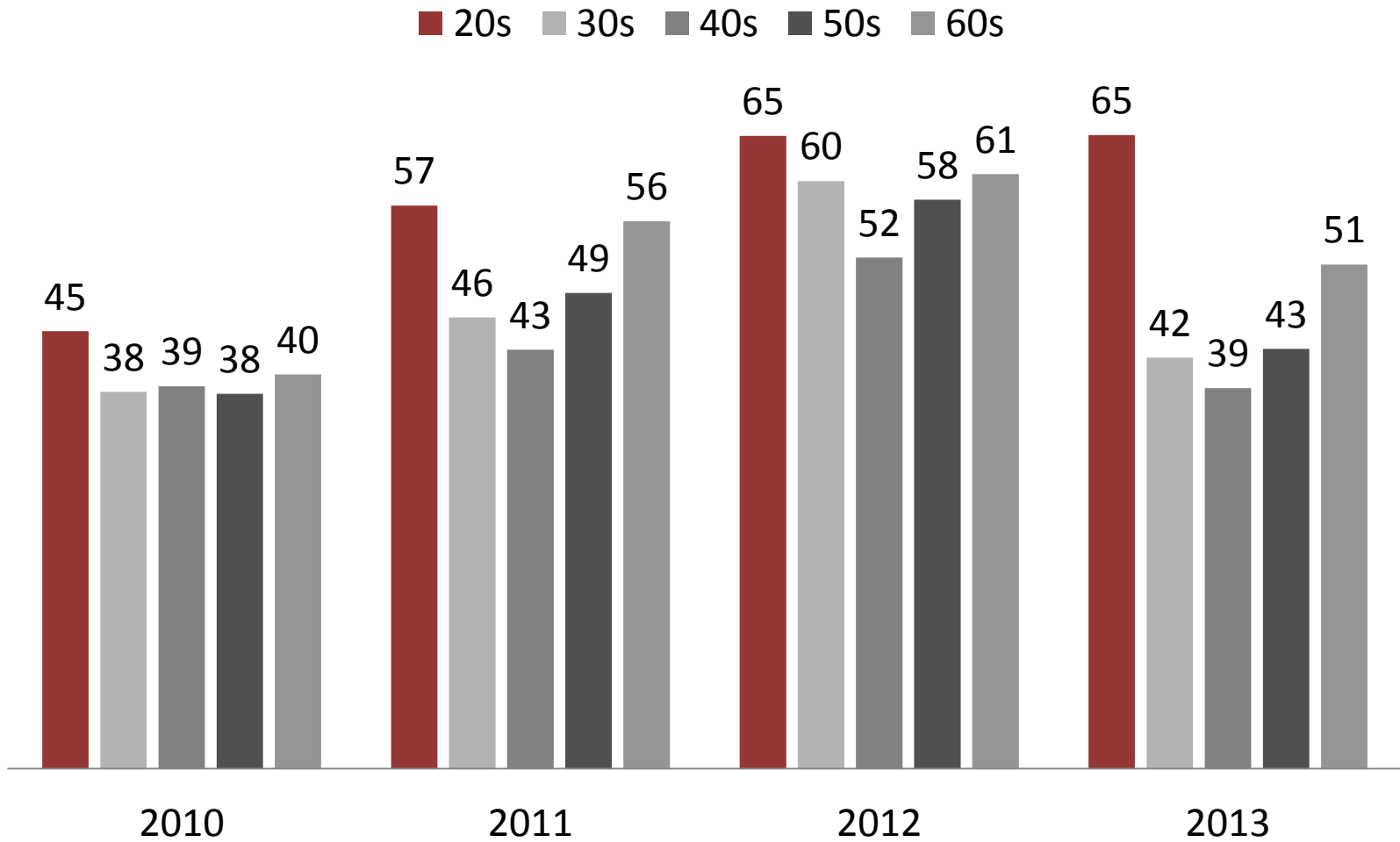

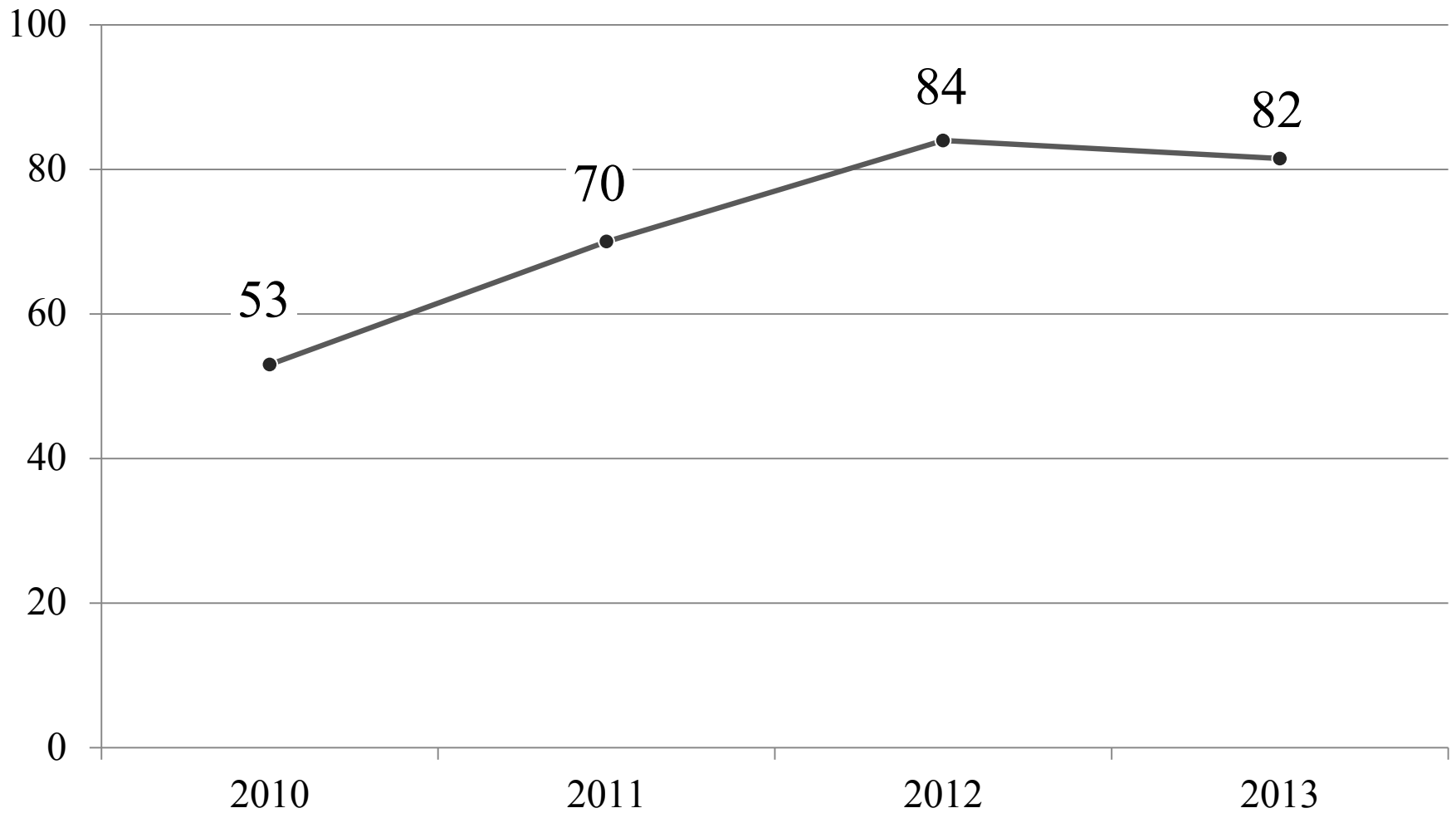

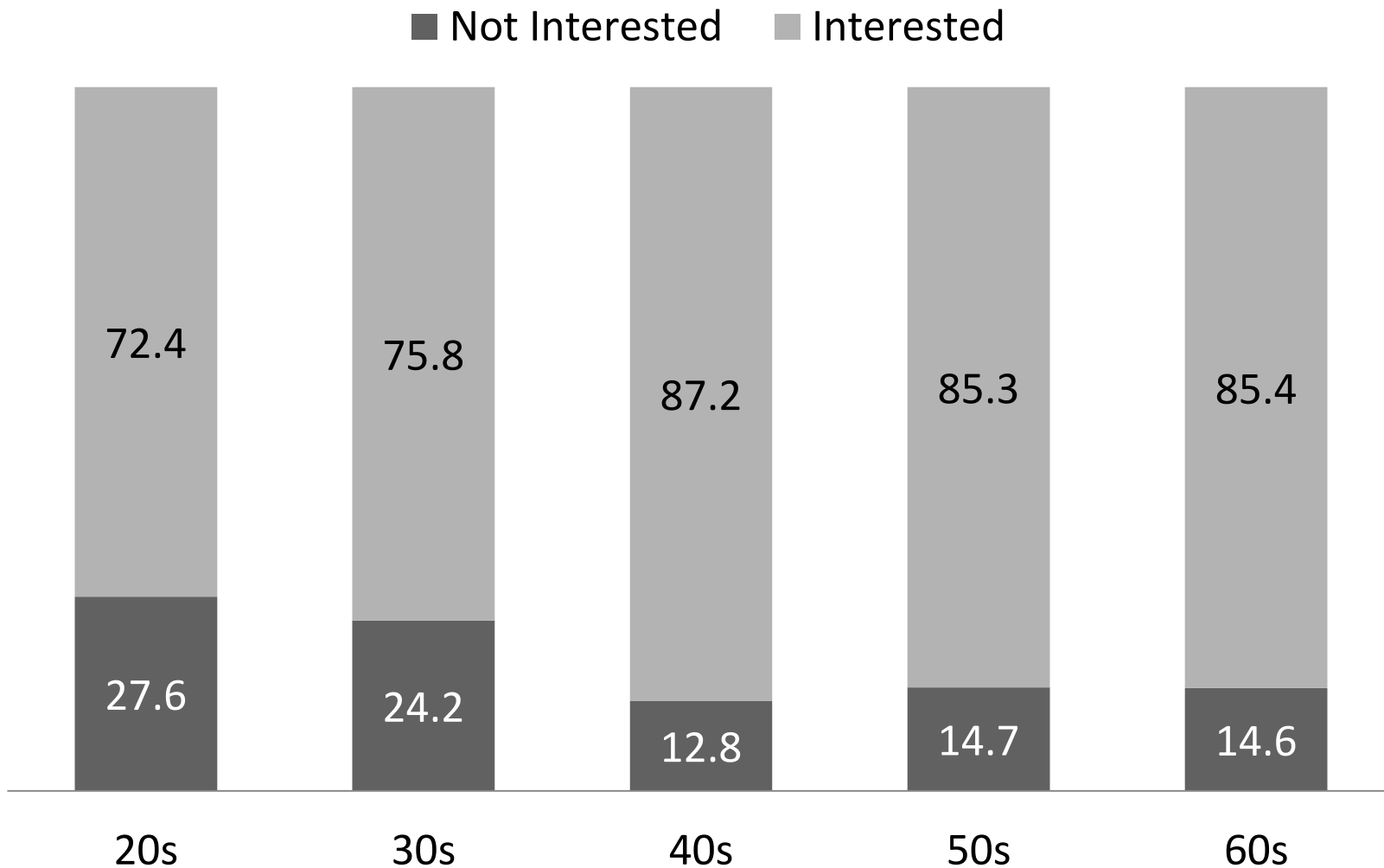

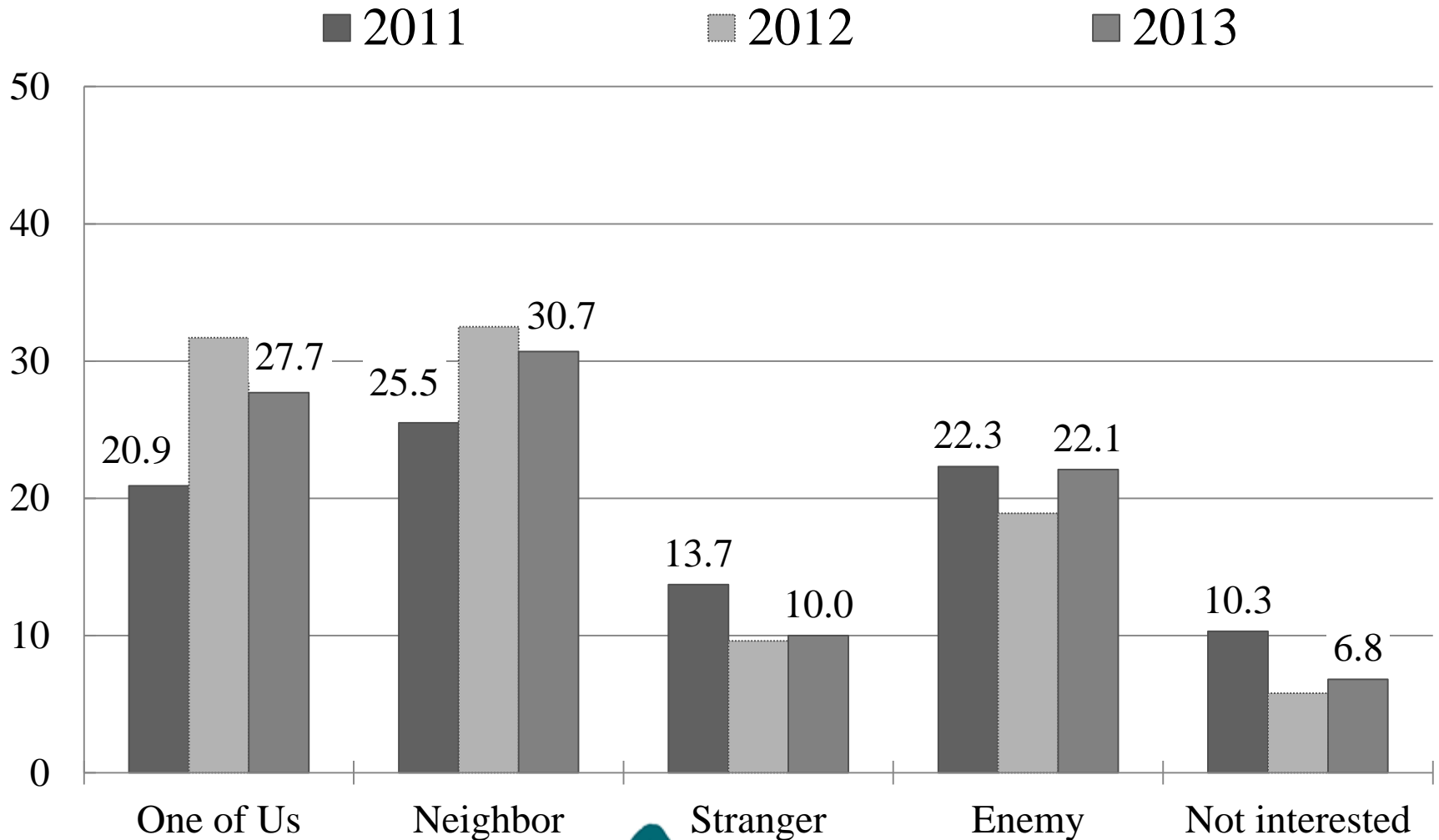

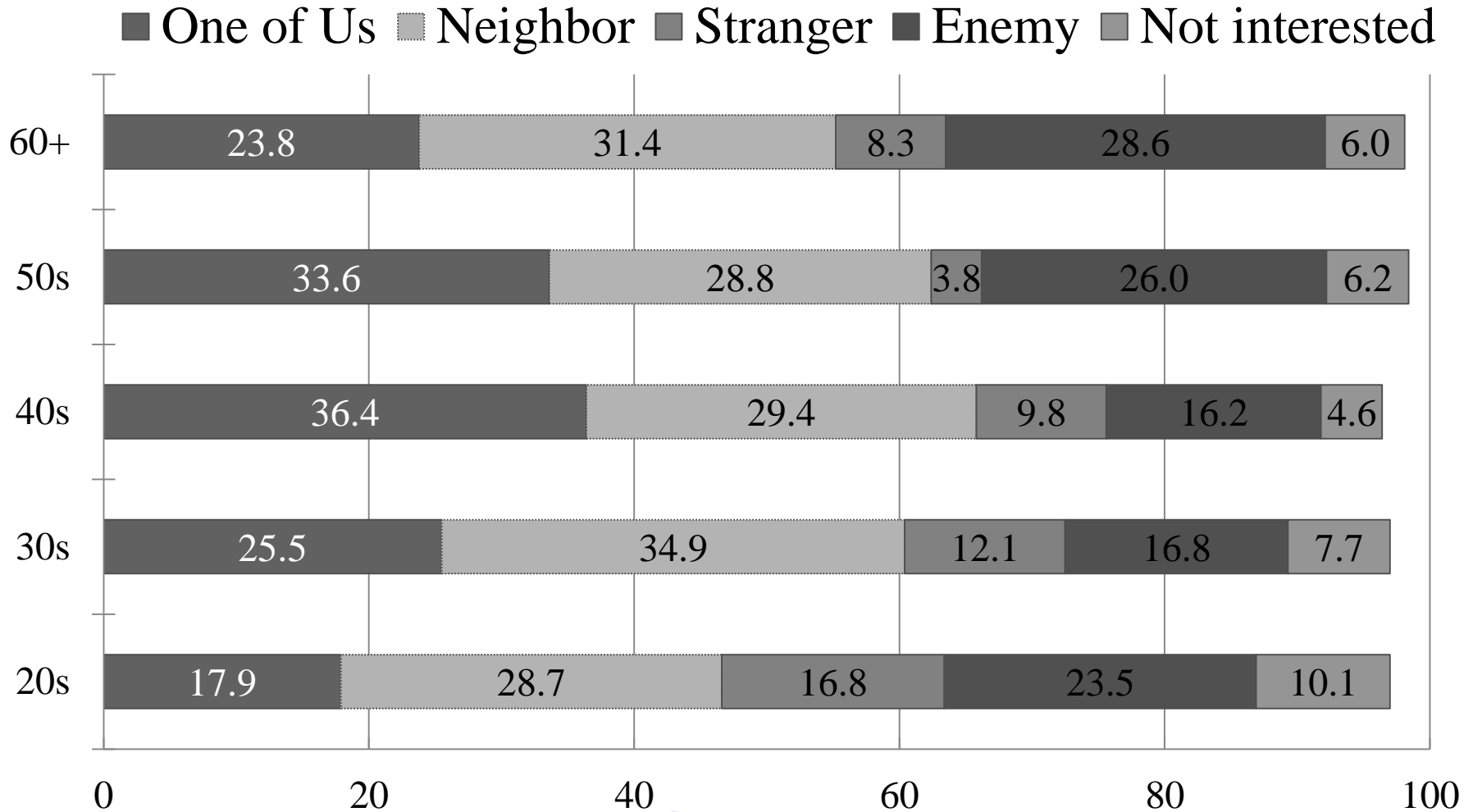

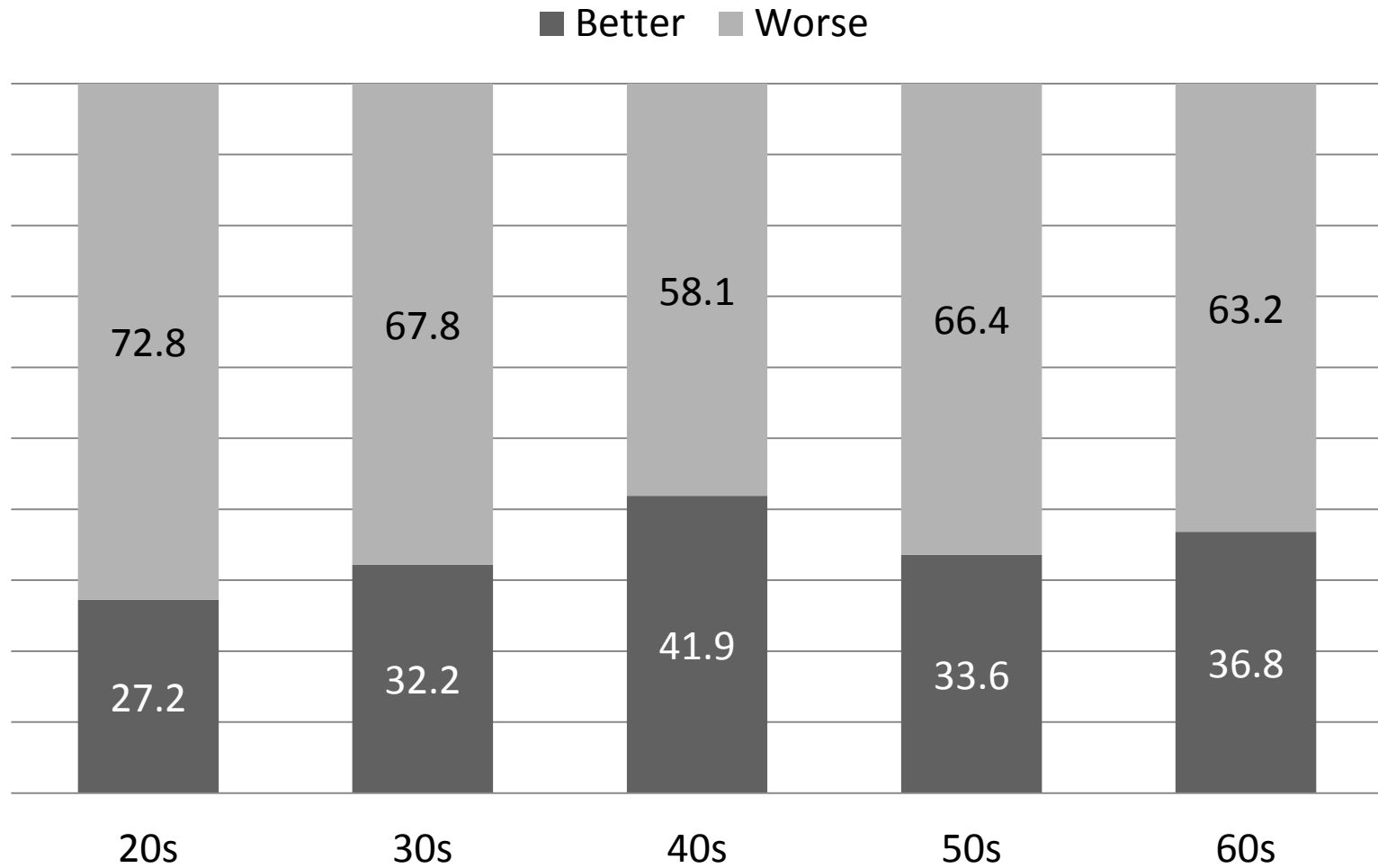
