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


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About the Asan Institute



Mission Statement

As an independent, non-partisan think tank, the Asan Institute for Policy Studies is dedicated to undertaking policy-relevant research to foster domestic, regional, and international environments conducive to peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula.

The Asan Institute was established in commemoration of the Founder and Honorary Chairman of Hyundai Group, Chung Ju-yung, who left an indelible mark on South Korea's modernization and inter-Korean exchanges towards peace.

Named after Chung Ju-yung's pen name, "Asan," Dr. MJ Chung founded the Asan Institute on February 11, 2008 to become a world-class think tank that mirrors South Korea's place on the world stage.

Center for Foreign Policy and National Security

The Center for Foreign Policy and National Security was established to help devise foreign affairs and national security policies that contribute to the stability of Northeast Asia and the promotion of peace on the Korean Peninsula through theoretical considerations and empirical analysis of the ever-changing geopolitical environment internationally.

By holding joint academic conferences with a wide range of domestic and foreign research institutes, while also conducting research projects and releasing publications at the same time, the center plays an important role in contributing to the revitalization of public-private cooperation networks as it heightens the level of social discourse. The main research topics are related to multilateral cooperation and regional security, public diplomacy, and comparative analysis of foreign affairs and national security policies by country.




Center for Regional Studies

The Center for Regional Studies consists of four separate program areas – the United States, China, Japan, the Middle East, and Southeast Asia & Oceania – with the programs all attempting to analyze and understand each region by carrying out research on their relations with Korea. This includes a host of pending responsibilities and issues, notably those concerned with politics, economics, society & culture, and international relations in each specific area. While exploring the direction of foreign policy through detailed investigations into a particular region and its associated countries, the center highlights Korea's role as a developed and technologically advanced country in the always-changing international community.



O How would you rate the favorability of the following leaders?





Asan Report (right) South Korean Public Opinion on ROK-U.S. Bilateral Ties


MOST IMPORTANT COUNTRY FOR SOUTH KOREA'S ECONOMY

C Which country is most important for South Korea's economy?







The Public Opinion Studies Team is contributing to the drafting of policies and collecting data on public opinion by analyzing how domestic sentiment is changing through public opinion surveys and statistical analysis. On the other hand, it is also summarizing and evaluating policies using mathematical modelling, such as quantitative analysis and statistical tools, and coming up with future policy alternatives based on these results. What's more is that by disclosing a large amount of qualitative and quantitative data to experts and the public at large, the team is also playing a critical role in encouraging social discourse to derive policy alternatives.


SOUTH KOREA'S FUTURE PARTNER


Asan Symposium


Joint Research

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














The Asan Forum (online English journal)






